# **TWISS**

A system designed to score across a variety of multiplayer boardgames.

- Only games comprising 4 players or more will count.
- Only games generally lasting for 45mins or more will count.

## **Scoring of Games**

A game is worth the total of the following:

- 6, plus
- 2x number of players, plus
- 2x length of game in hours \*\*

\*\* Game length refers to the time that a game is designed to last generally, not the actually time that the particular game took to play. Players therefore cannot manipulate scores by making a game last longer. (A 2-hr game that takes 4 hrs to conclude, will be scored as a 2-hr game.)

#### **Examples:**

A 4-player Settlers, which usually lasts 2 hours, is worth: 6+8+4=18 A 5-player Powergrid, which generally lasts 2.5 hours, is worth: 6+10+5=21 A 7-player Diplomacy, which generally lasts 5hrs, is worth 6+14+10=30

#### Placings:

The player who comes 1st in the game gets the game score, i.e. 100% The player coming 2nd gets 50% of the game score
The player coming 3rd gets 25% of the game score
All other players in the game gets 10% of the game score

For team games, such as 'Fury of Dracula' and 'Battlestar Galactica' etc: Each player on the winning side gets 75% of the game score Each player on the losing side gets 25% of the game score

### **Tournament Results**

Where players play a variety of games, some of which multiple times, the following calculates the player's tournament score.

A player's Best 4 scores will count.

If a player has played a particular game more than once, only his best result of that game will count.

To separate players on equal points at the end of the tournament, the following tie-breakers will be used:

The player with the most number of 1<sup>st</sup> wins. Then,

The player with the most number of 2<sup>nd</sup>s. Then,

The player with the most number of 3<sup>rd</sup>s. Then,

The player who has played the most number of games throughout the event.

If these tie-breaks fail, then the players are considered to have come equal.
